Two associate professorships – Fine Art

Jutland Art Academy is looking for two visual artists to fill two positions as associate professor of artistic practice. One of these associate professorships becomes vacant on 1 January 2018, the other on 1 August 2018. Both positions correspond to a half full-time position, equalling 80 hours per month on average. The positions are limited tenures set at four years with the option of negotiating a two-year extension once the four-year tenure nears completion.

We are looking for practicing artists with a proven high-profile artistic production that qualifies them for the role. Successful applicants should also have teaching experience, particularly within art education at post-secondary degree level (higher education). Each new associate professor must be willing to become part of the **academy's** existing network and to forge new connections and collaborations in connection with their work at Jutland Art Academy. Preference will be given to applicants who can demonstrate past participation in national and/or international collaborative projects.

Each position involves teaching, student guidance/careers advice (for approximately 15 students), and participating in excursions and study trips. It will also include faculty-related work in the form of meetings, timetabling, course administration and development, etc. Successful applicants may also be **involved in administrative and institutional work in the form of participation in the academy's councils** and/or board of directors.

The working hours will be 80 hours per month on average. As a general rule, teaching will take up 36 hours each month. Teaching is conducted from 1 September to 31 May; some meeting activity is to be expected in June and August.

We are looking for a candidate who can teach in both English and a Scandinavian language.

Jutland Art Academy employs an open education structure that combines elective workshops, which are available to all students, with obligatory courses aimed at specific years. The academy constitutes a single department, and all educators are expected to handle different teaching methods that cut across different media while maintaining high professional standards. The associate professors will take part in the faculty work, meaning that they will be involved in the ongoing discussion and evolution of the **academy's teaching and academic profile. We place emphasis on the new associate professors' ability** to take part in this work, and their visions for the academy, its teaching, structure and working climate will be welcomed and appreciated.

The salary offered is in accordance with Danish collective agreements within the field, meaning that it currently amounts to DKK 212,149 per year incl. pension. Applicants who do not live in or near Aarhus will be offered a fixed salary supplement as compensation for travelling expenses. Any costs for temporary accommodation necessitated by the discharge of the duties as associate professor will be defrayed by the academy.

Your application must include information on your views on art, your views on education and teaching, one or more examples of courses held by you, a detailed CV, and documentation demonstrating your artistic practice and teaching experience. Moreover, please note if you will be available for a start in January or August 2018.

We encourage applications from all interested parties regardless of age, gender and country of origin. Jutland Art Academy is an equal opportunity employer.
